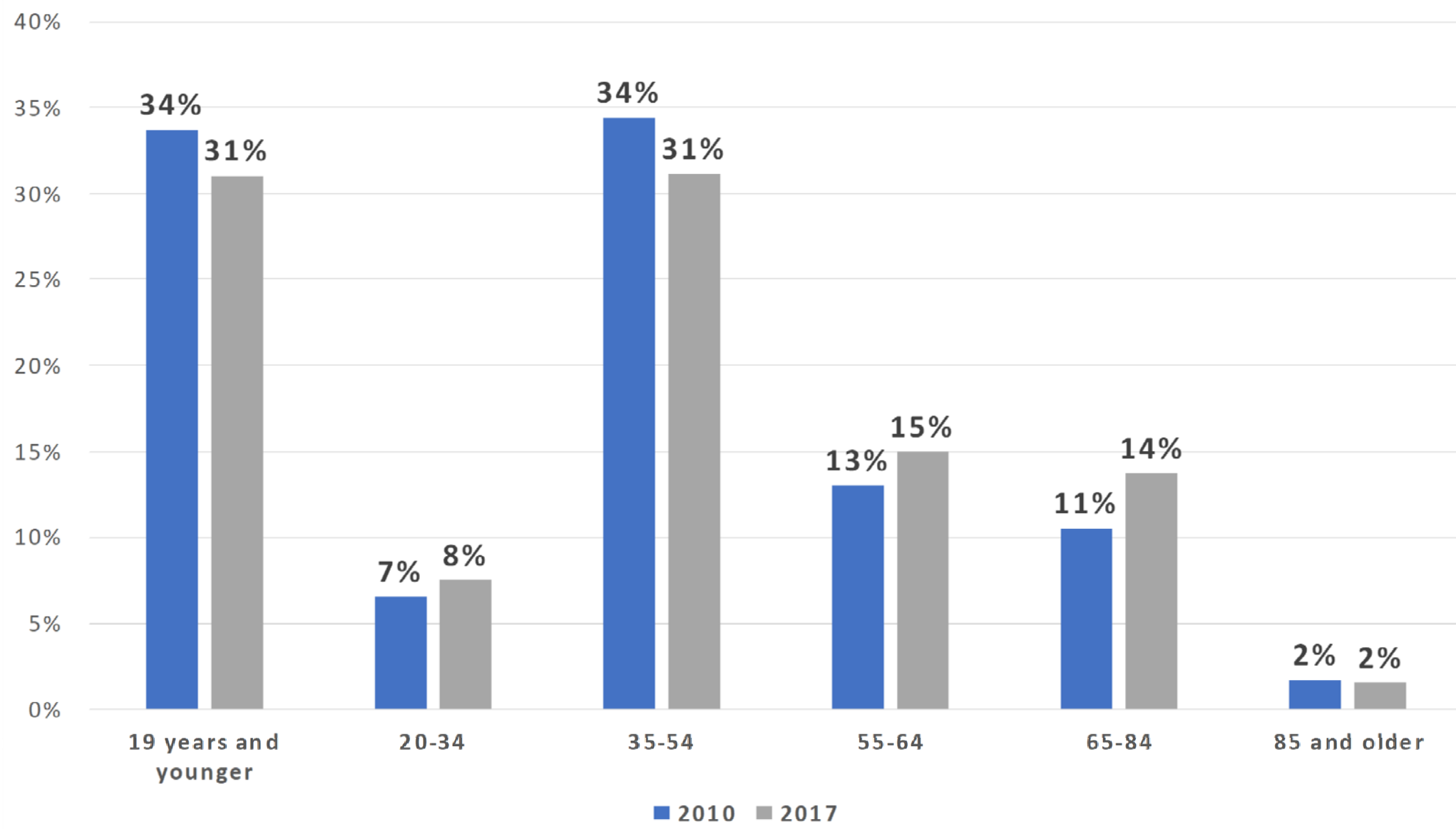

AGE



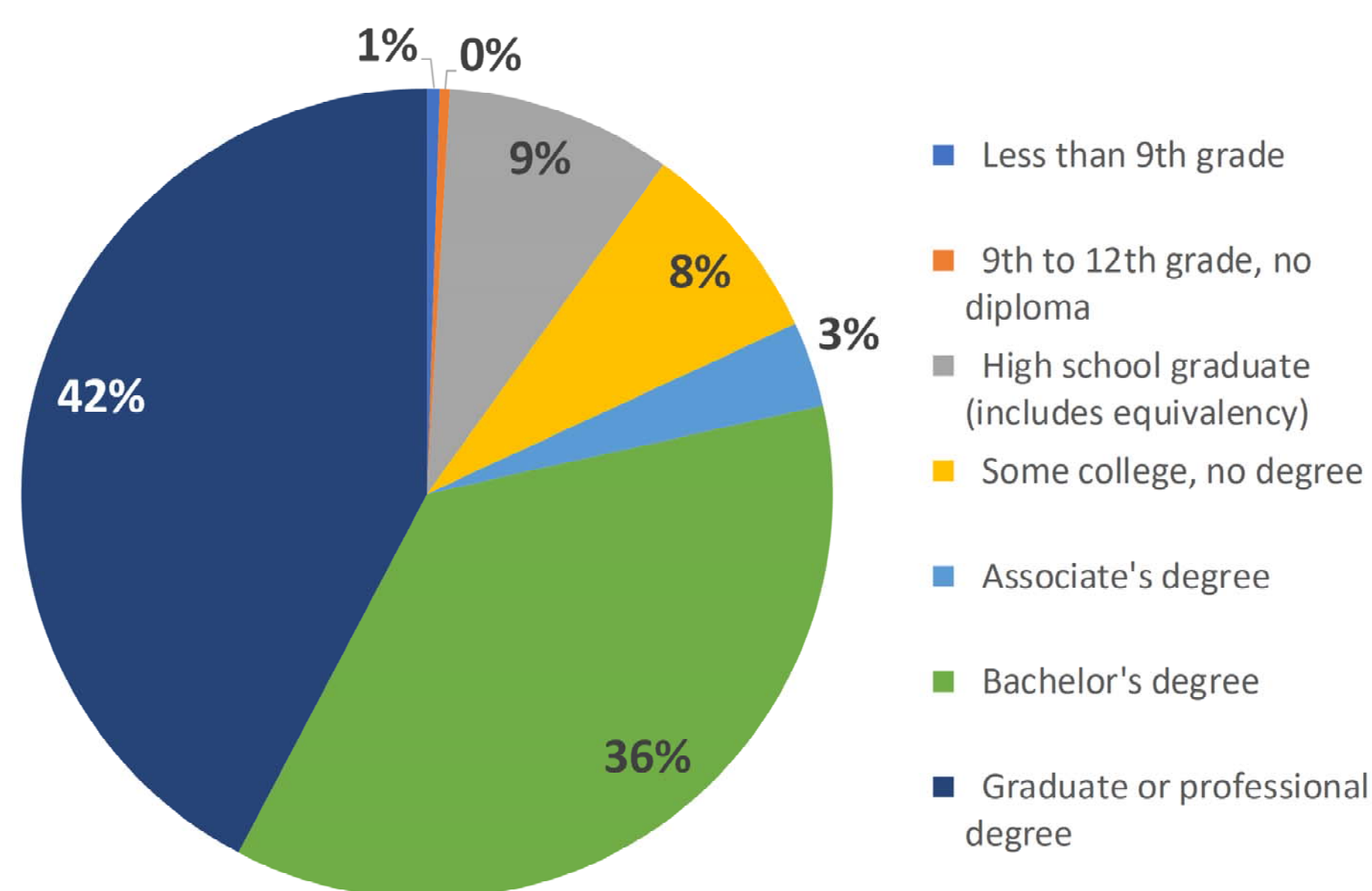

The 2017 US Census estimated that the largest age groups in Sudbury residents were 19 years and younger and 35-54 years old. While still a smaller portion of the Town's total population, the number of older residents increased at a higher rate. From 2000 to 2017, residents between the ages of 65 and 84 experienced the most growth of all age groups with an increase of 78%, with those 55 to 64 years not far behind at 72%. The percentage of residents 85 years remained approximately the same.

Sudbury is a well-educated community. In 2017, nearly 80% of the population age 25 years and older had a bachelor's degree or higher. Over the same period of time, those with a graduate or professional degree increased 10%. People with only a high school diploma declined to 1%.

The household composition in Sudbury has not drastically changed in the last 20 years; however, what has changed is the percent of family households with their own children under 18 years, which decreased slightly from 51% in 2010 to 46% in 2017. Another notable change was the percentage of households with individuals living alone that were 65 years and older, which increased from 6% in 2000 to 8% in 2017.

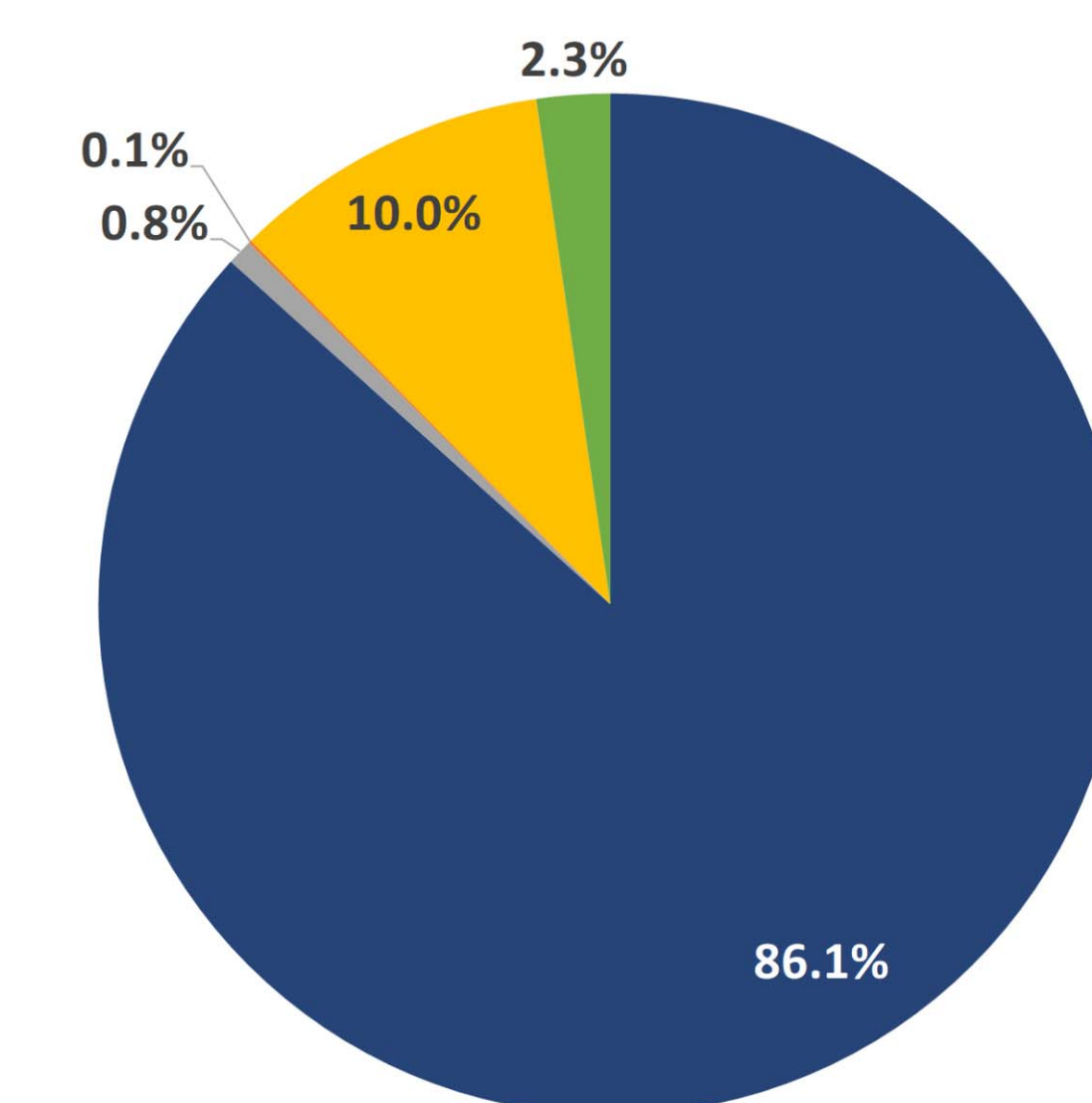

Between 2000 and 2017 the median household income in Sudbury increased by an estimated 44%; however, when adjusted using the Consumer Price Index to show 2017 dollars, the rise in income decreased a household's buying power for goods and services by 2%.

Most Sudbury residents still identify themselves as one race, predominately white. The percentage change in Black or African American residents increased by 10% between 2000 and 2017. For other non-white residents, the overall number continues to grow slowly, however the percentages for some groups shows doubling or tripling in number.
